

Finding a missing family member

The Red Cross helps family members separated from each other to reconnect and keep in contact. The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) coordinates searches in connection with natural disasters, conflicts and migrations. The ICRC processes thousands of new tracing requests each year.

The national Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies around the world participate in finding missing family members. The Finnish Red Cross is a part of this worldwide network.

Tracing requests are processed at the Finnish Red Cross headquarters. The service is confidential and personal data is processed securely. During the tracing process, the tracing request is forwarded to the International Committee of the Red Cross, which is in charge of the tracing work. The Finnish Red Cross contacts the person looking for their loved ones at different phases of the search.

How to make a tracing request

1. Complete the tracing request form.

The form can be filled by a close relative or their guardian/representative.
